Determined – to be the best version of yourself






"Good behaviour is a necessary condition for learning"

The purpose of our system is:

- To ensure your child's learning is not interrupted by low level, poor behaviour choices of others
- 2. To focus on the **positive things** your child chooses to do and give praise for doing them
- 3. To provide a **consistent whole school approach to behaviour.** All teachers will follow this policy
- 4. Responsibility for your child's behaviour choices lies with **them** ... it is <u>their</u> choice

Strategies to support wellbeing and learning

A 'Personalised Learning Centre' (PLC) that comprises of a SEND base, counselling service and Year manager support Two regulation rooms, weighted blankets, kinetic sand, lego therapy etc.

Numerous programmes such as; Zones of Regulation / Occupational Therapy / Anger Management Gremlins / Restorative Practices / Emotional Literacy support (ELSA), Drawing and Talking therapy / support for Emotional Based School Avoidance

Counselling and designated counsellor. Access to external support; MIND, CAMHS, Listening Post, Harbour, Being Me, Wellbeing Nurse Service, Future Steps ...

Over 150 children regularly access one or more of these provisions.

- Speak our Safely (SOS)
- We are a 'no touching' school
- Non-teaching Designated Safeguarding Lead
- Positive play
- Year 7 have their own designated lunch break



Monitoring visit October 23:

The school has strengthened all areas of pastoral care.

Leaders have improved systems relating to attendance and safeguarding.

The culture of safeguarding is strong.

Leaders work with external agencies to ensure that the most vulnerable pupils receive the support they need.

March '23 monitoring report:

'The new SENDCo has ensured that the special educational needs and/or disabilities (SEND) register is accurate'.

We have successfully applied for 4 new EHCPs (Increased from 8 to 12 since September 2022;

'This means that pupils with additional needs are now being identified more quickly.

Leaders have thought carefully about the support they can offer pupils with SEND through the school's personalised learning centre'.

March '24 monitoring report:

'Teachers are given clear information about how to support pupils with special educational needs and/or abilities. Pupils with SEND are helped to access the curriculum alongside their classmates'.
